5. I promise to use only my password.
6. I promise to only share my password with my teacher or parents.
7. I promise to tell an adult if I read or see something on the computer, iPad, or other device that is not appropriate.
8. I promise to ask for help if I don't know what to do. I understand that if I break any of my promises, I might not be able to use the computer, iPads, or other devices.
